#### COATS AND JACKETS!!

Fall weather is upon us - our daytime temperatures are all over the place! Please send a <u>coat</u>, <u>jacket</u>, <u>sweatshirt</u>, <u>or sweater (marked with their name or initials)</u> to school with your children. We are outside at many different times during our school day. Besides our normal recess times, teachers are also taking their classes outside to give their students a break from wearing their masks all day. PE and Music classes may still be outside depending on the weather. It is beginning to stay cold all day and we still have several students that didn't bring jackets to school. We will try to continue to have classes outside until it just gets too cold.

#### LOST AND FOUND

If your child can't find their mask, jacket, sweater, and/or sweatshirt - Our lost and found is overflowing!! We have many, many masks, jackets, sweaters, and sweatshirts that are not marked with their owner's name or initials in them. We also have several lunch boxes, and hats and gloves that are not labeled. Please ask your child to check the lost and found if he/she is missing any of these items.

## STUDENTS AND SIBLINGS WITH SUSPECTED COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

If a student is sent home sick with suspected COVID 19 symptoms (cough, fever, diarrhea, shortness of breath, stomach ache, vomiting, etc.) must all their siblings/household members be sent home as well and quarantined for 14 calendar days?

Yes, if one of the household members is being evaluated for COVID 19, the rest of the household must be quarantined until an alternative diagnosis is made or a negative result is received. Medical evaluation and COVID 19 diagnostic testing are strongly recommended for all persons with COVID-like symptoms. If the sick student becomes a confirmed case (tests positive for COVID) or a probable case (has symptoms and is linked to a known case), the Adams County Health Dept. will conduct contact tracing and will place household contacts, including siblings, in quarantine for 14 calendar days. The Health Dept. will also provide guidance on how to safely quarantine and isolate within the household.

<u>UPDATED INFORMATION as of 10/14/2020</u>: If testing in not performed due to the clinical judgment of the healthcare provider, a medical note is needed to return to school documenting that there is no clinical suspicion for COVID-19 infection and indicate an alternative diagnosis with the exclusion consistent with this diagnosis. Your child may then return to school on the day his/her doctor indicates on their medical note. Healthy siblings may then return to school.

### HOT LUNCH PROGRAM UPDATE

St. Peter School has been notified that we have received an extension of free lunch for our students until the end of our 2020-2021 school year! The federal school lunch program will be providing funds for this program.
