COATS AND JACKETS

With the cooler weather upon us, we ask that you please send a coat, jacket, or sweater with your children to school. We are outside at many different times during our school day. Besides our normal recess times, teachers are also taking their classes outside to teach in order to give students a break from wearing their masks all day. We also have classes just go outside for 10 minutes or so for a mask break. Our PE and Music classes are also held outside. It has been quite chilly outside the past several mornings and we had quite a few students that didn't have jackets to keep them warm. We will continue to have classes outside until it just gets too cold.

STUDENTS AND SIBLINGS WITH SUSPECTED COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

If a student is sent home sick with suspected COVID 19 symptoms (cough, fever, diarrhea, shortness of breath, stomach ache, vomiting, etc.) must all their siblings/household members be sent home as well and quarantined for 14 calendar days?

Yes, if one of the household members is being evaluated for COVID 19, the rest of the household must be quarantined until an alternative diagnosis is made or a negative result is received. Medical evaluation and COVID 19 diagnostic testing are strongly recommended for all persons with COVID-like symptoms. If the sick student becomes a confirmed case (tests positive for COVID) or a probable case (has symptoms and is linked to a known case), the Adams County Health Dept. will conduct contact tracing and will place

household contacts, including siblings, in quarantine for 14 calendar days. The Health Dept. will also provide quidance on how to safely quarantine and isolate within the household.

<u>UPDATED INFORMATION</u> as of 10/14/2020: If testing in not performed due to the clinical judgment of the healthcare provider, a medical note is needed to return to school documenting that there is no clinical suspicion for COVID-19 infection and indicate an alternative diagnosis with the exclusion consistent with this diagnosis. Your child may then return to school on the day his/her doctor indicates on their medical note. Healthy siblings may then return to school.

PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

Due to safety concerns with the COVID 19 virus, our Parent Teacher Conferences will be held virtually this year. Each teacher will be creating their own schedule for your child/ren's conferences. We are very proud of our students and want to share their accomplishments with you. Dates for this year's Parent Teacher Conferences are October 26-29th. We ask that you plan on 15 minutes for your child's conference. Please keep in mind that every student, Kindergarten through 8th grade, is expected to have a Parent Teacher Conference.

NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH WEEK

Last week was National School Lunch Week. Mrs. Garrett and her fantastic crew wanted to share a few more tips about how families can help their children enjoy school hot lunches. One suggestion is to talk with your child about what's on the menu. Make sure he or she knows about all the foods that are included for lunch that day or week.
