PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

Thank you so much to all our families that have signed up for Parent Teacher Conferences. Please plan on 15 minutes for your conference. We are so very proud of our students and want to share their accomplishments with you. If you have not yet scheduled your child's conference, we ask that you make every effort to contact his/her teacher and find a day/time that will work for your family. Please keep in mind that every student, Kindergarten through 8th grade, is expected to have a Parent Teacher Conference.

STUDENTS AND SIBLINGS WITH SUSPECTED COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

If a student is sent home sick with suspected COVID 19 symptoms (cough, fever, diarrhea, shortness of breath, stomach ache, vomiting, etc.) must all their siblings/household members be sent home as well and quarantined for 14 calendar days?

Yes, if one of the household members is being evaluated for COVID 19, the rest of the household must be quarantined until an alternative diagnosis is made or a negative result is received. Medical evaluation and COVID 19 diagnostic testing are strongly recommended for all persons with COVID-like symptoms. If the sick student becomes a confirmed case (tests positive for COVID) or a probable case (has symptoms and is linked to a known case), the Adams County Health Dept. will conduct contact tracing and will place household contacts, including siblings, in quarantine for 14 calendar days. The Health Dept. will also provide quidance on how to safely quarantine and isolate within the household.

<u>UPDATED INFORMATION as of 10/14/2020:</u> If testing in not performed due to the clinical judgment of the healthcare provider, a medical note is needed to return to school documenting that there is no clinical suspicion for COVID-19 infection and indicate an alternative diagnosis with the exclusion consistent with this diagnosis. Your child may then return to school on the day his/her doctor indicates on their medical note. Healthy siblings may then return to school.

St. Peter School has been notified that we have received an extension of free lunch for our students until the end of our 2020-2021 school year! The federal school lunch program will be providing funds for this program.
