Congratulations go out to Mrs. Maria Mast, Mrs. Chris Reichert, Mrs. Sandy Gallaher and Mrs. Emily Mellon for receiving grant money from Western Catholic Union (Classroom Assistance Program). Mr. Andy Flachs delivered a check for \$750.00 this past week that will assist in making specific purchases for our students. Mrs. Gallaher will be purchasing additional magnetic boards and letters for the Kindergarten reading/literacy block. Mrs. Mellon will be using the funds to purchase a selection of diverse books for her second grade classroom library and for read alouds. Additionally, Mrs. Mast and Mrs. Reichert plan to purchase a magnetic portable room divider.

COVID 19 UPDATES/INFORMATION - DECEMBER 2020

St. Peter School will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation throughout our school and community. Processes are in place to track cases in which a student or adult in our school is impacted by the virus. We follow the latest guidance from the Adams County Health Department (ACHD) in determining which individuals need to be quarantined to protect everyone in our school setting.

Just a reminder, to keep everyone informed, we are providing the current number of positive cases for student and staff in our Weekly Updates. This will be on the first page of our Weekly Updates, directly following the posted calendar activities for the week. Please know, that in accordance with federal law, no information will be disclosed that could lead to the identification of any individual.

STUDENTS AND SIBLINGS WITH SUSPECTED COVID-19 SYMPTOMS-Please read the newest updated guidelines listed below

If a student is sent home sick with suspected COVID 19 symptoms (fever, unusual fatigue, muscle pain, cough, sudden loss of taste or smell, difficulty breathing, prolonged headache, sore throat, diarrhea, stomachache, and/or vomiting) must all their siblings/household members be sent home as well and guarantined for 14 calendar days?

Yes, if one of the household members is being evaluated for COVID 19, the rest of the household must be quarantined until an alternative diagnosis is made or a negative result is received. Medical evaluation and COVID 19 diagnostic testing are strongly recommended for all persons with COVID-like symptoms. If the sick student becomes a confirmed case (tests positive for COVID) or a probable case (has symptoms and is linked to a known case), the Adams County Health Dept. will conduct contact tracing and will place household contacts, including siblings, in quarantine for 14 calendar days. The Health Dept. will also provide guidance on how to safely quarantine and isolate within the household.

If testing in not performed due to the clinical judgment of the healthcare provider, a medical note is needed to return to school documenting that there is no clinical suspicion for COVID-19 infection and indicate an alternative diagnosis with the exclusion consistent with this diagnosis. Your child may then return to school on the day his/her doctor indicates on their medical note. Healthy siblings may then return to school.

UPDATED GUIDELINES from the Adams County Health Dept. as of 12/08/2020:

ACHD Quarantine Guidelines:

 Please note that the ACHD continues to recommend a quarantine period of 14 days for individuals deemed to be a close contact of a positive COVID case. Any household contacts must remain in quarantine through 14 days after the most recent (last) date
of exposure. Household members cannot test out of quarantine and cannot be released from
quarantine until Day 15.

ACHD Quarantine Guideline Changes:

- Exposures occurring outside of the household Quarantine can end after Day 10 without a COVID
 test and if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring. Under these circumstances, an
 individual could return to school on Day 11.
- For Students <u>At this time, children under the age of 18 cannot test out of quarantine.</u> This is due to the lack of data using children on testing and validating during studies/research
- For School Staff members only An individual can return to school on Day 8 **IF** a PCR test (not a rapid test) is completed on Day 7 of exposure and is Negative. The PCR test is available at Blessing Drive-Thru, QMG, and/or Hy-Vee and can take 24-72 hours for results.
- An example of these new guidelines would be ... if a student/staff member at school is determined to have positive COVID test results and attended school that day, students that were exposed and deemed to be in close contact with the person with COVID would be quarantined by the ACHD. While in quarantine if the students that were exposed do not have symptoms for 10 days, then they could return to school on Day 11. For a staff member that was deemed to be in close contact with someone that has a positive test result if this staff member does not have symptoms while in quarantine for 7 days and they receive a negative COVID PCR test (not a rapid test) that was administered on Day 7, then they could return to school on Day 8.

As always, the ACHD will process the COVID exposure cases at St. Peter School and will contact a family individually to explain these guidelines as well as answer any questions regarding your individual situation. ACHD will also follow up with all close contacts. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this information on the new guidelines, please contact me and I would be happy to help you. Thanks for your patience as we adjust to the rapidly changing guidelines.
