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### MORNING DROP OFF PROCEDURE

With our students' safety in mind, we just want to remind parents of our morning drop off procedure. We ask that you form two lines - the first car in each lane should pull all the way towards where Mrs. Reichert is standing. This will allow 3 cars in each lane to release their children. When it is time for your child(ren) to exit your car please have them follow these guidelines. Students in the south lane (closest to the school) please exit your car and walk on the sidewalk to the main school doors. Students in cars in the north lane, please exit your car and walk to the crosswalk - these children will then walk as a group to the school doors. Once your children have left your car and are safely out of the way, you will then be allowed to leave. The next cars in both lanes should stay in their lanes and pull forward in lines to where Mrs. Reichert is standing. Please do not cross lanes! This new group of students will then also exit their cars following the same procedure. We will continue this process until all cars are through the lines.

We also ask that cars in our lines please not block the crosswalk so that children can walk safely to the school doors. Parents that choose to park in the parking lot instead of pulling into the drop off lanes,

should walk with their children to the cross walk to ensure their safety. Thank you so much for your help and cooperation!

# END OF SCHOOL DAY DISMISSAL

Recently, at the end of our school day, we have noticed that several parents have been begun parking along the Madison Park Road to pick up their children. Please do not do this! All students should be picked up in the front or lower parking lots. Our back lot is reserved for the 6 QPS and Daycare busses that come to pick up some of our students. We have watched parents and children walk out in front of the busses/vans and not realize they are blocking their way out of the lot. We have also seen a child run out in front of a bus! Some parents have pulled out from their parking spot as our busses are trying to leave. We know that none of these incidents are done on purpose. However, not only are these very unsafe conditions but our bus drivers are on schedules. Please give them consideration to meet their student's needs and schedule.

#### DAYCARE ATTENDANCE REMINDER

We just want to remind parents that if your children are planning attend our St. Peter Morning/After School Daycare to please complete their weekly schedules. These schedules must be completed and submitted to our daycare. We realize that emergencies happen during the day and we will do our best to accommodate families. We do, however, highly discourage children coming at the last minute. These schedules are very important for our program in order to ensure that we have the appropriate members of staff present for each day.

#### COVID GUIDELINES REMINDER

Even though the schools are no longer required to take children's/adult's temperatures as they enter our buildings, the Health Department has not changed the guidance for keeping home all children when one sibling is ill with any of the symptoms below:

"Send home or deny entry (and provide remote instruction) if ANY of the following symptoms are present: Fever (100.4°F or higher), new onset of moderate to severe headache, shortness of breath, new cough, sore throat, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain from unknown cause, congestion/runny nose, new loss of sense of taste or smell, nausea, fatigue from unknown cause, muscle or body aches. Medical Evaluation and Testing are Strongly Recommended for ALL Persons with COVID-Like Symptoms."

We truly thank all our families for your help, perseverance, and patience as we all navigate through all the effects and challenges of the COVID 19 virus. We ask everyone to please continue to remain diligent in taking their child's temperature every morning before coming to school and to continue to follow all the set guidelines in hopes that we can soon return to a safer and healthy environment for our students, faculty, and staff.

#### WATER BOTTLES

We want to remind our families to please send your children to school with their own water bottle. We are still not allowed to use any water fountains. We do have water fillers located in our buildings that your child can safely refill his/her water bottle. Since returning from Christmas vacation, we have had many students no longer bringing their water bottle to school. We have, of course, been providing water to these students but it is becoming quite an expense to our school. We will continue to provide water to students that need it but we ask that if at all possible they bring their own water bottle from home. Many children are asking for water and then just take a drink or two and throw it away. This is not only expensive to the school but the waste is upsetting. Thank you so much for your help with this.
