Dear Parishioners,


"On the evening of that fist day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said, 'PEACE BE WITH YOU.'" This is the first appearance by the risen Jesus to the apostles. As it is well described, these followers were locked away, paralyzed by the fear in their lives that what happened to Jesus could also happen to them. Instead of scolding them for their lack of faith, Jesus offers them a gift that was forever a reflection of God's love, forgiveness, and mercy, namely, the gift of peace within themselves. Not only does He offer this gift to them, Jesus then states that this gift was to be a part of their ministry as they continued the ministry of Jesus. Our gospel states that "He breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.'" Thus the Sacrament of Reconciliation is instituted by Christ and would give God's divine forgiveness and mercy to all generations of God's people until the end of time.

And so, the Second Sunday of Easter has been designated by the Church as "DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY." As the Church states, "the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that humankind will experience in the years to come."


One person who understood and lived this Divine Mercy of the Lord was a humble, Polish nun, Maria Faustyna Kowalska, also known as St Maria Faustyna Kowalska. She was born in 1905 and died in 1938. In her brief life span, Our Lord appeared to her in a number of occasions, inspiring her to promote a devotion to the Divine Mercy, and that she did, earning her the title of "Secretary of Divine Mercy." In these apparitions, St. Faustina heard Jesus say some of the following, words found in her diary to celebrate and live:

- 1. "My heart overflows with great mercy for souls, especially for poor sinners. If only they could understand that I am the best of Fathers to them and that it is for them that the Blood and Water flowed from my Heart as from a fount overflowing with mercy.
- 2. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for the poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of grace upon those souls who approach the fount of my Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flowed are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet."

As we look ahead in our calendar, next Sunday, April 18th, our third grade students will be celebrating their reception of First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation at two Masses, either at 1:00 p.m. or 4:00 p.m. I ask you to remember them in your prayers. Because of the pandemic, I have been given the privilege as pastor to celebrate these sacraments with them. May these two sacraments draw them ever closer to the Risen Christ and His Mercy.

students.


STATIONS OF THE CROSS
