



Dear Parents and Guardians,

Thank you sincerely for choosing a Catholic education for the spiritual and academic development of your child(ren). Our schools are the primary ministry of the parish. The generosity of our parishioners ensures our schools are a vibrant center of catechesis, faith formation, discipleship, and stewardship. This can only be achieved if our parishes are thriving and healthy.

In our ongoing effort to strengthen our parish communities and encourage active participation, we will introduce an updated Family School Agreement for the 2024-25 school year. This agreement builds upon what has been used in the past with two notable changes.

First, service hour requirements will be updated with emphasis placed on parish participation through ministries at Mass, participation on councils and committees, volunteering at the parish picnic, etc. We want to continue to strengthen the engagement of our school families with our parish.

Second, for our Catholic families, weekly and Holy Day Mass attendance is expected. The Eucharist is the cornerstone of our faith, and we know our families, parishes, schools, and community are strengthened when we spend time in worship together. With that in mind, we will now have a measurable expectation of weekly Mass participation. While we acknowledge that circumstances such as travel, illness, and the complexities of modern schedules may occasionally necessitate attending Mass at different parishes, remember that your parish community is an extension of your own family. Like any family, we feel a sense of absence when members are apart. Therefore, your family's attendance at your registered parish should be maintained at a minimum of 51% of the time.

More information will be shared at a later date on how this attendance will be monitored, as well as information on the required service hours. In the meantime, if you are Catholic and are not currently registered at a parish, any of the four of our parishes would welcome you. If you are a non-Catholic and would like to learn more about becoming Catholic, please reach out to the priest at your parish of choice.

We are excited to share these changes with you and look forward to how this will enliven our parish and school families to further live out their faith and support this mission of the Church. As with any change, we anticipate there will be questions. We plan to offer additional information/Q&A sessions this Spring and will communicate through principals with details once they are available. As a reminder, all families are expected to fulfill the obligations of the Family School Agreement.

We appreciate your continued prayers for our schools and parishes, and we pray for God's blessings upon you and our parish families in the year ahead.

Please note current QCES families who still owe tuition and/or fees for the current school year must pay their past due amount by Friday, May 31, 2024, in order to enroll their child(ren).

The QCES Foundation offers tuition assistance based on financial need. Applications, including required supporting documents, must be submitted through the FACTS Grant & Aid Program by April 5, 2024 for priority consideration. Applications will be accepted after that date, but there is no guarantee that tuition assistance funds will still be available. While funding is not guaranteed, families who fall within 200% of Federal Poverty Guidelines are encouraged to apply.

The QCES Foundation also facilitates multiple scholarships.

- Fr. Augustus Tolton Scholarship Full-tuition scholarship (K-8) awarded to one family at each of the four Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools.
- Newcomer's Scholarship Partially need based, full-tuition scholarship (K-8), either Catholic or non-Catholic, whose family does not currently have any children enrolled in one of Quincy's four Catholic Elementary Schools.
- St. Thomas Aquinas Scholarship Full-tuition and fees scholarship (K-8) for four students registered at one of the four Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools whose family does not currently have a student enrolled. The scholarship is intended for students of color, non-Catholic students, students below poverty level, or students with disabilities.

SAYING NO: OVERVIEW FOR PARENTS & CAREGIVERS

HOW CAN I PROTECT MY CHILD FROM HARM?

Sometimes kids face situations that are unsafe or are hurting them emotionally or physically. This can be scary for parents because we never want to see our children get hurt. While we can't protect them from everything in life, we can help them build skills to set boundaries and keep themselves safe.

TIPS FOR HELPING YOUR CHILD SET BOUNDARIES

1. IT IS OK TO SAY NO

Show your child that setting boundaries and asking for help are signs of strength, not weakness. You can tell them: "When we are struggling and we ask for help or tell someone 'no', we are growing strength and it gets easier every time we do it." If you share examples from your own life it really helps, because it gives them a social script and a model that they internalize in their minds and can draw on later. So you can say: "A friend asked me to go to a dinner that I really didn't want to go to. I felt nervous and scared about their reaction if I said no, so I went and I hated every minute of it and felt exhausted after! So the next time they asked me to go to a dinner I was brave and said no. It was still scary but I felt so much better afterwards! And I realised that it was ok to say no."

2. LIMITS IN THE HOME

When you set boundaries, if you do so calmly and firmly, without getting angry, this helps your child learn that 'no' is a normal and calm thing to say. It's easy for 'no' to become emotionally charged, which turns it into a scary word for kids. If we can give them examples where 'no' is not a big deal, this will help them stay calm and see the bigger picture when it comes to saying 'no' to someone else. You can use empathy to help keep the mood calm. You can say things like: "I'm sorry, I know it's hard, but it's not going to happen." And then lightly change the subject to something else.

3. RESPONSIBILITY

Give them increasing amounts of responsibility to make choices and decide what they want. You can tell them: "I would like to spend some time with you tomorrow, why don't you choose a fun activity for us?" Or: "Why don't you choose a meal that you like and we can cook it together?" It's surprisingly hard for us especially when we are young to actually listen IN to what we want – it is a skill that needs to be practiced. So the more opportunities you give your child to make an empowered choice based purely on how they FEEL, the more chance they have to build the muscle of paying attention to what is happening inside of them and setting boundaries based on that.

4. NON-REACTIVITY

If they accuse you of something or blame you for something, you can turn this unpleasant situation into one of the most helpful conversations you can have with your child. Validate and support their experience by saying: "I'm sorry you feel that way, that's definitely not my intention! What can we both to do change the dynamic?" This is role-modeling healthy respectful voicing and listening to boundaries. By not taking it personally or getting hooked into defending yourself, but simply listening, respecting their opinion (knowing it doesn't mean anything bad about you) and then working constructively with them to repair it, you are showing them how to disagree and set boundaries in a kind and compassionate way.


