We are excited to offer this event for our 7/8 grade students! We realize that for some this may be their first school dance. Please encourage your child to come, they will have a blast! If for some reason your plans change at the last minute such as a sports schedule change due to weather, please come and pay at the door. We want as many students as possible to come! This is not a dance in which students are asked to bring a "date." This is a social event for the students to get to know one another from the four Catholic Elementary Schools.

Rules and Guidelines: The 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> Grade Spring Dance is open to all QCES seventh and eighth grade students. (No outside guests are permitted.) **Doors will open at 6:45 p.m**. Music will start at 7:00 p.m. All students must arrive by 7:15 p.m. and be picked up no later than 9:00 p.m. Parents must come inside the QND gym to pick up their child. Children will not be allowed to wait in the parking lot or walk home or elsewhere. Students must remain at the dance until picked up and signed out by a parent.

<u>Dress Code for the Event</u>: dress attire for all students will be considered as "Sunday Best," similar to a wedding, Easter Sunday, or Confirmation attire. **No** jeans, shorts or t-shirts. This is **NOT** a formal attire event. Please do not go out and spend a lot of money on new clothes.

<u>Girls</u> who wear dresses: Dresses must be no shorter than two inches above the knee. If the dress is sleeveless or strapless, a light sweater or wrap must be worn at all times to cover the shoulders. No high heels are permitted.

Dear 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Parents,

It is time to begin the planning for your student's 8<sup>th</sup> grade class trip to Washington DC scheduled for **October 5-10, 2025!** This will be my 22<sup>nd</sup> Washington DC trip and 21<sup>st</sup> year leading the trip for our eighth graders. I am thankful that Fr. Bauer had the inspiration and foresight to start this trip back in 1985 and thankful I was called to continue his legacy back in 2004. I would also like to thank the administration and our outstanding teachers for their continued support. Without their support, the trip would NOT be possible.

# A meeting for all 7<sup>th</sup> grade parents will be held Wednesday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, 6:00 PM in the St. Peter's Cafeteria.

I will be discussing the following: The schedule including all the sites we plan to visit, to chaperone or not to chaperone, expectations of the students and chaperones, disciplinary concerns, safety of our students, the estimated cost of the trip, and answer any questions you may have.

**CHAPERONES:** Now is the time to sign up for <u>consideration</u> as a chaperone. Chaperones will be chosen and contacted in June by me in order to give you time to arrange your schedule. Remember, this is <u>not</u> a trip for the chaperones. It is all about our students' education & safety. Personally, I would love to take everyone on this trip, but it just is not possible due to class size, the number of parents who want to go, and transportation limitations.

Please keep the following in mind before asking for **consideration** as a chaperone:

- Monday is physically exhausting, <u>38-40 hours</u> with little or no sleep along with **briskly** walking <u>10-12 miles each day</u>, so <u>you must be in good physical condition</u>.
- You will be responsible for a group of 8-10 students and must be able to be firm but kind and deal with basic 8<sup>th</sup> grade issues such as a student getting sick or other 8<sup>th</sup> grade drama.
- We are on a very tight schedule; I depend on adults to help keep students on schedule.
- I, along with the teachers, are in charge. Chaperones MUST follow the teachers' instructions. If a teacher corrects a student, chaperones must respectfully support the teacher.
- Chaperones must also pay the cost of the trip plus meals.

If you have a heart for youth ministry, you will love the trip and it will be a week that you will never forget! If you just want to "babysit" your child, this may **NOT** be a trip for you.

For planning and reservation purposes, I need to know the approximate number of students who are planning on going on the trip. This trip is entirely optional. Those that choose not to go, however, will have to attend school the entire week. The decision to send your child is completely yours. Please weigh the risks and benefits carefully. The risks, as you already know, are the risk of travel, and the risk of city streets. The benefit, however, is the once in a lifetime opportunity for your child to experience the greatest six-day educational experience ever. I will make every effort to make this a positive weeklong experience they will never forget.

In addition to the number of students who plan on going, I will need <u>ALL information</u> on the next page from each parent who would like to be considered as a chaperone. No money is due at this time. Payment will be due in early September. A letter will follow in the fall at the start of the school year.

I am looking forward to meeting you. If for some reason you cannot attend the meeting, please return the 2<sup>nd</sup> page of this letter to school by May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025. If you should have any questions, please contact me directly at my office: **217-223-0046.** Sincerely,


