- Physical exam on Illinois form with updated immunization record sign by doctor and parent. Due by Oct. 15, 2025
- Copy of birth certificate. Due by Oct. 15, 2025
- Copy of baptismal certificate Due by Oct. 15, 2025

Kindergarten Students:

- Physical exam on Illinois form with updated immunization record signed by doctor and parent. Due by Oct. 15, 2025.
- Eye exam on Illinois form due by Oct. 15, 2025.
- Copy of birth certificate due by Oct. 15, 2025.
- Copy of baptismal certificate due by Oct. 15, 2025.
- Dental Exam on Illinois form due by May 15, 2026.

Second Grade Students:

- Dental exam is due by May 15, 2026.

Sixth Grade Students:

- Physical exam on Illinois form with updated immunization record signed by a doctor and a parent. Due by October 15, 2025.
- Dental exam on Illinois due by May 15, 2026.

Sports Physical:

- If your child is participating in ANY sport, they must have a sports physical on file prior to the season's first practice. A school physical can be used in lieu of a sports physical; however, a sports physical <u>CAN NOT</u> be accepted as proof of a physical examination for mandated physicals. Sports physicals are valid for 395 calendar days from the date the physical was issued.

New Students- Transferring from another Illinois School

- Transfer of current Illinois school health records (physical exam with up-to-day immunizations, dental exam, and eye exam. Health requirements for grade level as noted above.)

- <u>Classroom Requests for the 2025-2026 School Year:</u> When planning for the 2025-2026 school year, we are not able to honor requests for classroom placements of students. Students are assigned to homerooms based on teacher/administration recommendation.



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
